The Truth about False  
Confessions: Why Do  
Juveniles Confess?**

Dozens of Illinois prisoners have been exonerated after being wrongfully convicted of offenses they did not commit. Many were juveniles when they were convicted.

*Juveniles are particularly susceptible to suggestive and coercive interrogations. This phenomenon was recently highlighted in the popular Netflix drama "Making a Murderer."*

Today at 11:10, we will meet and hear from Adam Gray, who confessed at the age of 14 to a double arson murder, and who was recently exonerated. Adam was represented by Northminster's own Terri Mascherin and a team from Jenner & Block LLP and the University of Chicago Exoneration Project.
