

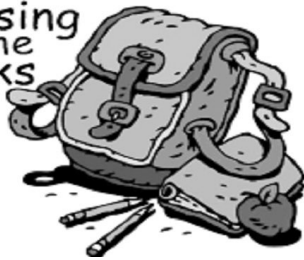
AN EXCITING SUMMER CONTINUES AT NORTHMINSTER!

on August 12th

From June 16-23, over 550 Presbyterian clergy and Ruling Elders gathered in St. Louis as Commissioners to the 223rd General Assembly of the PC(USA). They considered a number of ministry, mission, social justice, and church governance issues.
