The Truth about False Confessions: Why Do Juveniles Confess?

Dozens of Illinois prisoners have been exonerated after being wrongfully convicted of offenses they did not commit. Many were juveniles when they were convicted.

Juveniles are particularly susceptible to suggestive and coercive interrogations. This phenomenon was recently highlighted in the popular Netflix drama "Making a Murderer."

Next Sunday at 11:10, we will hear from Adam Gray, who confessed at the age of 14 to a double arson murder, and who was recently exonerated. Adam was represented by Northminster's own Terri Mascherin and a team from Jenner & Block LLP and the University of Chicago Exoneration Project.
