A Community
Conversation about the
"new" Sanctuary
Movement in Evanston**

For many years, the Sanctuary Movement largely involved faith communities providing safe harbor for refugees or immigrants who it was felt were unfairly facing deportation. Today, communities of faith in Evanston are being asked to take a broader look at Sanctuary, particularly in light of recent developments.

On Sunday, Nov. 12th at 11:10 in the sanctuary, join Pastor Michael and members the Session for a conversation about the proposed Evanston Sanctuary Community Statement being considered by dozens of Evanston faith communities, faith-based organizations and secular groups.
