Rosamond E. Herklots (1905-1987) wrote the text to both the Introit and the Choral Benediction. An English Catholic hymn writer, she said the words for these verses largely came to her while trying to remove the roots of weeds from her nephew's garden in 1966.

Today's version of the Lord's Prayer can be found in the Purple Hymnal on page 35 and uses "debts" and "debtors."

Our confession sequence is an expansion of a widely distributed Lenten prayer originally written in Australia for Waverly College.

This week in Sunday School Northminster's youngest will be in Children's Chapel following the Time with Children. We come, at the beginning of our Lenten journey, aware of God's steadfast love helping us to overcome life's trials and temptations which can descend on us at any time.

This first Sunday in Lent (not "of Lent" because technically Sundays aren't a part of Lent), we begin with one of Jesus' most troubling parables, The Parable of the Unforgiving Servant. Listen for how hyperbole and exaggeration are used as teaching tools here.

"Live in Charity" is one of the simple contemporary chants created by the late Jacques Berthier for the ecumenical Taize community in France. In that community, it is sung in many different languages, and Latin, so that there is at least one language where all can sing together, regardless of nationality.

Pastor Michael wrote our closing hymn on his hymn writing retreat in the last week of 2018. This is the first time it has been sung.
